ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Medical Board of Medical Examiners ("The Board") upon receipt of Dr. Jeck Charles N. Jeck's application for reinstatement of his license to practice medicine in the State of New Jersey.

On or about May 8, 2002, Dr. Jeck pled guilty to one count of second degree dispensing Oxycodone without medical necessity to two patients. By way of Consent Order filed on May 5, 2003 with the New Jersey Board of Medical Examiners, Dr. Jeck agreed to a revocation of his license to practice with no right to petition for

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reinstatement until May 2007.

On April 23, 2008 Dr. Jeck appeared and testified before a committee of the Board in support of his petition for reinstatement of his medical license. He testified that, following his conviction, he served 68 days in prison followed by one year of parole and an additional two years of probation. During probation, he reported and provided a weekly urine sample. Dr. Jeck provided a letter from his parole officer confirming his successful completion of parole.

Since approximately 2004, Dr. Jeck has been employed as a salesman by the Community Medical Equipment and Home Health Care Corporation in the Pennsylvania area. He also worked as an adjunct professor in various institutions teaching anatomy and physiology, EKG, vena puncture and other basic medical classes to pharmacy technicians, physician's assistants, nurses and other students following his probationary period in 2004. Presently, Dr. Jeck is employed as a full time adjunct professor at Dawn Training Center in Delaware. His employers are all aware that his license to practice medicine in New Jersey was revoked in 2003.

Dr. Jeck acknowledged that he had inappropriate personal relationships with the two female patients that were the subject of his criminal conviction. Dr. Jeck voluntarily enrolled in the PROBE ethics program in January 2008, prior to seeking reinstatement of his medical license. Dr. Jeck was unable to successfully complete the program due to an unexpected and emergent

medical condition resulting in surgery during the last week of the program. However, he testified that participation in the program was helpful and that it underscored his understanding that having personal relationships with patients is unethical. At the request of the Board, Dr. Jeck enrolled in and successfully completed the PRIME ethics course in August 2008 and was granted 20 hours of continuing education credit.

The Committee questioned Dr. Jeck extensively regarding his current knowledge of the practice of medicine. Dr. Jeck acknowledged he has been out of medical practice since May 2002, but explained that he has kept current with the medical field through reading journal articles, taking continuing education courses, the internet and his work as an adjunct professor. At the Board's request, Dr. Jeck enrolled in and successfully completed the Maintenance of Certification Preparation Course (22.5 credit hours) given by the American College of Physicians in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in September, 2008. Dr. Jeck also completed more than 40 credit hours in a review course in the elements of Family Practice given by the Pennsylvania Osteopathic Medical Association.

Dr. Jeck has complied fully with the 2003 Consent Order of Revocation, including payment of all fines.

Dr. Jeck being desirous of resolving this matter without the necessity of further formal proceedings, and agreeing to waive any right of same, and the Board having determined that this Order is sufficiently protective of the public health, safety and welfare,

and all parties agreeing to the terms of this Order;

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 10th day of April, 2009,

ORDERED THAT:

1. Dr. Jeck shall successfully complete all application requirements including a criminal history background check for any actions not mentioned above and payment of all reinstatement fees.
2. After Dr. Jeck has complied with all the requirements of paragraph one on this Order to the satisfaction of the Board, Dr. Jeck's license to practice medicine shall be reinstated subject to the conditions in paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Order.
3. Dr. Jeck shall work only in an office setting under the direct supervision of a physician pre-approved by the Board. He shall not engage in home care. The supervisor shall have direct contact with Dr. Jeck on a regular basis, but not less than 3 times a week. The supervisor shall submit written notification to and receive approval from of the Executive Director of the Board prior to any week in which he will not meet with Dr. Jeck at least three times. The supervisor shall have knowledge of Dr. Jeck's past boundary and other violations, and shall have the authority to require appropriate professional behavior of Dr. Jeck. The supervisor shall meet with Dr. Jeck to discuss his progress and oversee his work schedule and patient interactions. The supervisor shall review such patient records or other documents necessary for appropriate supervision. Prior to Dr. Jeck beginning employment,

the supervisor shall confirm with the Board, in writing, that he/she has seen this consent order and agrees to supervise Dr. Jeck and report as indicated in paragraphs six and nine below.

4. Dr. Jeck shall not prescribe any Schedule I or II Controlled Dangerous Substance (CDS).

5. Dr. Jeck shall use serialized prescription blanks manufactured in triplicate for all prescriptions and shall not provide electronic or telephonic prescriptions. Copies of every prescription shall be made available to his supervising physician, who shall document his approval of all CDS prescriptions (other than Schedule I or II) within 48 hours by signing and dating a copy of the prescription.

6. Every^T three months, the supervising physician shall provide the Board with a written report detailing Dr. Jeck's practice of medicine along with copies of each prescription written by Dr. Jeck, including those prescriptions for CDS which have been signed by the supervising physician.

7. A chaperone shall be present whenever Dr. Jeck sees or examines a female patient for any reason whatsoever. The chaperone shall be present throughout the patient encounter and shall maintain a clear line of sight to the patient. The chaperone shall initial or sign the patient record next to the appropriate visit to verify that she was present for the entire patient encounter and examination.

a. The chaperone shall be a licensed or certified health

care professional who holds a valid and unencumbered license issued pursuant to a Chapter of Title 45 of the New Jersey Statutes;


- b. The chaperone must be approved, in advance, by the Board;
 - c. Dr. Jeck shall furnish to the Board the full name, home address, telephone number, type of license and license number of each chaperone. Dr. Jeck shall inform the Board withing 10 days of any changes in any of the information he provides to the Board with regard to the chaperone.
8. Dr. Jeck shall be entirely responsible for any and all costs or expenses associated with the use of the chaperone and supervisor as required by the terms of this Order. Dr. Jeck shall not charge any patient, third-party payor or government benefits program for the use of the chaperone or supervisor.
9. The chaperone and supervisor shall immediately (within forty-eight (48) hours of occurrence) report to the Board orally and in writing any actions by Dr. Jeck in violation of this Order, any boundary violation, any inappropriate prescribing, violation of the statutes and regulations governing the practice of medicine, or failure to cooperate with the chaperone or supervision.
10. Dr. Jeck hereby waives any claim of privilege or confidentiality he may have with regard to any information that the chaperone or supervisor may provide under the provisions of this Order to the Board, the Attorney General or the Medical Director, and agrees that such information may be utilized in any proceeding regarding his license.
11. Dr. Jeck shall take all reasonably necessary actions to

assure the cooperation of the chaperone and supervisor with the Board, the Attorney General, and the Medical Director.

12. The terms of this Order shall remain in effect for a minimum of two years. In the event that Dr. Jeck seeks to amend the terms of this Order at any time in the future, Dr. Jeck is required to appear before a committee of the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners.




