Barham that all instructors should be advised that their course <u>must include a competency test in the propane teaching</u>; Mr. Jones should be informed that his course must include the one (1) hour of propane and corresponding competency test, all in compliance with:

N.J.A.C. 13:32A-4.3 REQUIRED COURSE TOPICS

d) During the biennial renewal period beginning July 1, 2016 and ending on June 30, 2018, sponsors of continuing education courses shall include one hour of education in propane services which includes substantially the same information covered in either the Fundamentals of LP manual, 2007 edition or the Gas Installation for UA Journeyworkers and Apprentices manual, 2003 edition.

e) After completion of the education in propane services required by (d) above, sponsors of continuing education courses shall administer a competency evaluation examination, which tests a licensed master HVACR contractor's understanding of the information provided on propane services.

Removes certain Master HVACR licensing requirements for licensed electrical contractors for 12 months. Board Members submitted individual comments by email to Ms. Glasgow. A <u>formal Board comment</u> and motion were requested by Ms. Glasgow.

A motion was made by Paul J. Mitchell and seconded by William C. Barham that the Board maintains its strong opposition to this legislation as noted in the individual comments sent to the Assigned Analyst, Ms. Glasgow, prior to this agenda. A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

SYNOPSIS

REQUIRES ATTORNEY GENERAL PROVIDE ACTIVE SUPERVISION OF CERTAIN OCCUPATIONAL AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSING BOARDS

On March 7, 2017, the Board agreed in a motion made by Thomas C. Pitcherello and seconded by Dominic D. Demico that Members are in favor of the intent of this legislation. No other comments were made. A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

FROM: GARY LEWIS, CONSTRUCTION OFFICIAL, CITY OF SUMMIT NJ

Is an installer of natural gas-fired decorative fireplaces and gas piping exempt from the new HVACR licensing regulations? It is clearly not HVACR work.

On March 7, 2017, the Board responded and stated "No", the installer of natural gasfired decorative fireplaces and gas piping are <u>not</u> exempt from the new HVACR licensing regulations. This work is regarded as gas and fuel piping, and remains with the scope of practice of a Licensed Master Plumber or a Master HVACR Contractor.

A motion was made by Dominic D. Demico, Jr., and seconded by Paul J. Mitchell to advise Mr. Lewis accordingly. A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

11. INQUIRY

LETTER: JANUARY 29, 2017

FROM: SERVICE CONTRACTORS' ALLIANCE (SCA)

Is Home Serve USA in compliance with New Jersey HVACR licensing, physical location and Bona Fide Representation requirements to advertise and offer HVACR service contracts in New Jersey?

On March 7, 2017, the Board agreed that based on the limited information provided regarding the entity known as Home Serve USA, Members are unable to render a determination as to the compliance of the entity with New Jersey HVACR Statutes or Regulations.

A motion was made by Paul J. Mitchell and seconded by Thomas C. Pitcherello, to correspond with Home Serve USA and request details from them as to their license, location and any registration by them as a bona fide representative legally able to provide HVACR service contracts in the State of New Jersey.

A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

12. INQUIRY

EMAIL: FEBRUARY 17, 2017 FROM: GORDON LEWIS

Is a licensed HVACR Contractor required to provide you "up front" with their hourly labor rate if requested? I am working with an HVACR Contractor who will only give me a flat charge for a repair and will not provide parts and labor costs.

On March 7, 2017, the Board noted and DAG Donofrio confirmed that there is no existing HVACR Statute or Regulation that governs the manner of pricing, flat versus hourly, or otherwise, charged to a consumer by a licensed Master HVACR Contractor. A regulation does exist with respect to pricing; however, that regulation pertains only to unconscionable pricing. at N.J.A.C. 13:32A-5.8 Unconscionable pricing:

a) A master HVACR contractor shall not charge an unconscionable price for services. A price is unconscionable when, after review of the facts, a master HVACR contractor of ordinary prudence would be left with a definite and firm conviction that the price is so high as to be manifestly unconscionable or overreaching under the circumstances.

A motion was made by Paul J. Mitchell and seconded by Kevin S. Clark. A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

13. INQUIRY

EMAIL: FEBRUARY 18, 2017

FROM: SCOTT BISHOP- MASTER HVACR CONTRACTOR# 6197

I wanted clarification on the scope of work that organizations who work without a BFR under the exemptions provided in 13:32 A-1.1 e) & f).

These organizations are not subject to the licensing and BFR requirements of our Profession, because of the way they operate. These exemptions appear to allow only service and maintenance to be performed. Please confirm that these organizations cannot perform replacement or installation work without a BFR registered with the Board. Even though some of their employees may be Master HVACR contractors, this still does not give them the right to perform equipment replacement or new installations of HVACR systems.

On March 7, 2017, Members discussed this matter and concluded in a motion made by Paul J. Mitchell and seconded by William C. Barham, that in this regard, the Board confirmed that these exemptions are limited to those performing service, repair and maintenance work only. The Board noted that Mr. Bishop is correct in his interpretation of this regulation. A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

The Terkildsens may consider the options available within the HVACR Regulations whereby they may either hire. or partner with, a Master HVACR licensee to serve as a bona fide representative for their company, or, they may subcontract HVACR services to a licensed Master HVACR licensee.
