- c. A fax from Scott J. Druckman, D. O., Winslow Family Physicians, P.A., inquiring as to whether he can hire a physician assistant to be on the football field and the physician will be in constant communication with the physician assistant and available with a dedicated cell phone line.
- d. A fax and letter from Randall Lewis, M.D., stating that he and Cynthia Slater-Lewis, M.D., are opening a Medical Spa and inquiring as to whether physician assistants are allowed to perform the following procedures under the supervision of a physician: Botox injection, Selerotherapy, Collagen/Restylane injection, Mesotherapy injection and Operation of an Intense Pulsed light (IPL) device for photorejuevenation therapy.
- e. A letter from Paul C. Mendelowitz, M. D., Senior VP, Medical Affairs and Chief Medical Officer, Holy Name Hospital, inquiring as to whether a physician assistant can operate fluoroscopy equipment. He stated that the current regulation requires that a physician must operate the equipment that initiates the exposure of a patient to radiation. He inquired whether a physician assistant operating under the direction of a physician, could initiate the radiation exposure. He further states that the current regulation N.J.A.C. 13:35-2B.4 does not address this explicitly, but it does grant physician assistants the privilege to perform other invasive procedures.
