The Board will advise Ms. Lloyd that effective, February 13, 2003, the amended language contained in the Physical Therapy Statute permits direct access by consumers in New Jersey to the services of a physical therapist, thereby no referral for physical therapy service is required, except for reimbursement purposes and automobile accidents.

T.O.E.F.L. WAIVERS:

1. Jose Villanueva

Jose Villanueva appeared before the Board to request a waiver of the TOEFL requirement for foreign-educated individuals applying for licensure. Mr. Villanueva is applying for licensure by examination in the State of New Jersey. He was educated in the Philippines and received his professional as well as undergraduate education in the English language. Mr. Villanueva has plans to work in New Jersey.

Upon a motion made by Nancy Kirsch and seconded by Karen Wilk, the Board voted to grant Mr. Villanueva a waiver of the TOEFL requirement based upon the fact that his professional as well as undergraduate education was conducted in the English language and he demonstrated a proficiency in the English language. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

2. Milton John Modesto

Milton John Modesto appeared before the Board to request a waiver of the TOEFL requirement for foreign-educated individuals applying for licensure.

Mr. Modesto is applying for licensure by examination in the State of New Jersey. He was educated in the Philippines and received his professional as well as undergraduate education in the English language. He passed the TOEFL in 1997 with a score of 587. Mr. Modesto has plans to work in New Jersey.

Upon a motion made by Nancy Kirsch and seconded by Karen Wilk, the Board voted to grant Mr. Modesto a waiver of the TOEFL requirement based upon the fact that his professional as well as undergraduate education was conducted in the English language and he demonstrated a proficiency in the English language. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

3. Agnes Mendoza

Agnes Mendoza appeared before the Board to request a waiver of the TOEFL requirement for foreign-educated individuals applying for licensure.

Ms. Mendoza is applying for licensure by examination in the State of New Jersey. She was educated in the Philippines and received her professional as well as undergraduate education in the English language. She took the TOEFL in May of 2003 and received a score of 207 (213 is passing score). Ms. Mendoza has plans to work in New Jersey. Upon a motion made by Nancy Kirsch and seconded by Karen Wilk, the Board voted to grant Ms. Mendoza a waiver of the TOEFL requirement based upon the fact that her professional as well as undergraduate education was conducted in the English language and she demonstrated a proficiency in the English language.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

4. Angelo Santos

Angelo Santos appeared before the Board to request a waiver of the TOEFL requirement for foreign-educated individuals applying for licensure.

Mr. Santos is applying for licensure by endorsement in the State of New Jersey. He was educated in the Philippines and received his professional as well as undergraduate education in the English language. Mr. Santos is licensed in New York and has plans to work in New Jersey.

Upon a motion made by Nancy Kirsch and seconded by Karen Wilk, the Board voted to grant Mr. Santos a waiver of the TOEFL requirement based upon the fact that his professional as well as undergraduate education was conducted in the English language and he demonstrated a proficiency in the English language. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

5. Helen Hoi

Helen Go Ong Hoi appeared before the Board to request a waiver of the TOEFL requirement for foreign-educated individuals applying for licensure.

Ms. Ong Hoi is applying for licensure by endorsement in the State of New Jersey. She was educated in the Philippines and received his professional as well as undergraduate education in the English language. Ms. Hoi is licensed in New York and has plans to work in New Jersey.

Upon a motion made by Nancy Kirsch and seconded by Karen Wilk, the Board voted to grant Ms. Hoi a waiver of the TOEFL requirement based upon the fact that her professional as well as undergraduate education was conducted in the English language and she demonstrated a proficiency in the English language. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

IV NEW BUSINESS:

A. INQUIRY FROM JOHN CINTINEO, P.T. RE: LASER THERAPY PERFORMED BY PT

The Board considered an inquiry from Mr. Cintineo, a physical therapist who wrote to the Board regarding his purchase of a "low level" laser used to treat carpal tunnel syndrome. The Board will advise Mr. Cintineo that after the initial evaluation done by the P.T. has been completed the P.T. must determine the appropriate plan of care for the patient and if the laser treatment is part of that plan of care then the P.T. may administer that physical modality to that particular patient.

B. INQUIRY FROM PATRICIA B. TAYLOR, L.P.T.A. RE: PTA'S ABILITY TO SIGN INSURANCE CHARGE BILLS

Ms. Taylor wrote to inquire as to whether PTA's could sign insurance billing forms for physical therapy completed. While nothing prevents a PTA from signing an insurance billing form a P.T. must always co-sign according to N.J.A.C. 13:39A-3.4 (e) . Also as per N.J.A.C. 13:39A-3.4 (e) a licensed PT shall include on all bills submitted to a patient or third party payor the licensee's license number, which in this case would be the P.T.A. and the P.T.

C. INQUIRY FROM TIM O'KAY, PT RE: STANDARDS OF PROFESSIONAL BEHAVIOR

The Board will send a letter to Mr .Tim O'Kay thanking him for the information he supplied regarding the need for N.J.P.T. law to contain standards of professional behavior and will take it into consideration.

D. CORRESPONDENCE FROM SUE LINDEBLAD, PT- DIRECTOR CREDENTIALING SERVICES RE: COURSE WORK EVALUATION TOOL FOR FOREIGN EDUCATED PT'S 4TH EDITION

The Board considered this matter informational.

E. INQUIRY FROM KEITH RENNAR RE: ELECTRO MEDICAL STIM FLEX 400

The Board reviewed Mr. Rennar's inquiry regarding the use of Electro Therapy. Mr. Rennar will be notified that any procedure involving the use of a laser can only be done in New Jersey by a licensed healthcare practitioner within the scope of their practice.

F. INQUIRY FROM CAROLYN J. YOUNG RE: DIRECT ACCESS

The Board reviewed Ms. Young's inquiry about the need for a prescription in a school based setting and will respond stating that she herself can require a prescription however it is no longer a requirement to practice physical therapy in New Jersey.

G. INQUIRY FROM SHARRIE RAPAGNA, PT RE: VERBAL DIRECTION

The Board reviewed the inquiry from Ms. Rapagna and will respond stating that you do not need verbal or written direction from a physician to treat but if needed for reimbursement in Motor Vehicle cases it can be obtained from a physician. Ms. Rapagna needs to refer back to hospital policy on verbal orders.
