Take notice that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1, the rules at N.J.A.C. 13:45E were scheduled to expire on November 21, 2024. The rules implement the Health Care Professional Responsibility and Reporting Enhancement Act, N.J.S.A. 45:1-33 et seq.

Subchapter 1 outlines the purpose of the rules. Subchapter 2 sets forth definitions. Subchapter 3 establishes requirements for notification to the Clearing House Coordinator. Subchapter 4

establishes requirements for notification to a health care professional by a health care entity. Subchapter 5 contains rules concerning reports to the Clearing House Coordinator. Subchapter 6 establishes requirements for the disclosure of information to a health care entity. Subchapter 7 concerns confidentiality. Subchapter 8 concerns records. N.J.A.C. 13:45E Appendix sets forth the Health Care Professional Responsibility and Reporting Enhancement Act Reporting Form.

The Director of the Division of Consumer Affairs has reviewed the rules and has determined them to be necessary, reasonable, and proper for the purpose for which they were originally promulgated, as required by Executive Order No. 66 (1978). Therefore, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-33, specifically 45:1-41, and in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c(1), these rules are readopted and shall continue in effect for a seven-year period.
