##### **Equipment; General Operation of Bingo; Method of Play**

**Summary** of Public Comment and Agency Response:

The official comment period ended October 18, 2019. The Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission (Commission) received a comment from Bob Smolinsky.

COMMENT: The commenter requests that the Commission amend N.J.A.C. 13:47-8.4 to increase the number of instant raffle tickets that may be included in a deal from 10,000 to 12,000. The commenter contends that the higher ticket limitation would allow qualified organizations more flexibility to award higher prize amounts, would be easier for manufacturers as it is a multiple of 4,000, which was the previous ticket limitation, and would reduce recordkeeping requirements. The commenter contends that only eight other states limit instant raffle tickets and that five of those states impose a limitation of 4,000 or below, three impose a limit of 6,000, and one imposes a limit of 12,000.

RESPONSE: The Commission agrees that the ticket limitation should be raised to 12,000 and has changed N.J.A.C. 13:47-8.4.
