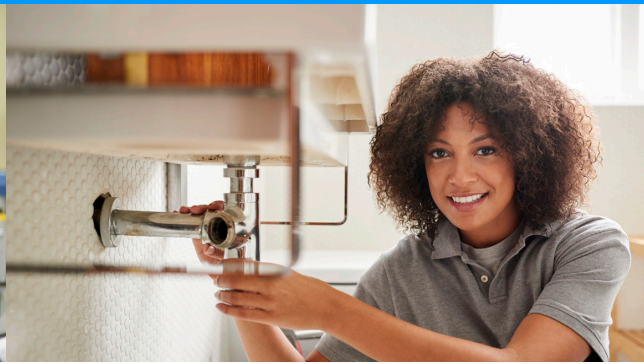

The New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs houses 51 professional and occupational boards and committees that license over 700,000 individuals.



New Jersey State law allows for all individuals, regardless of citizenship status, to obtain a professional or occupational license in New Jersey if all requirements for licensure are met.

What does this mean?

- Individuals with undocumented status are eligible for licensure.
- A social security number is not required for licensure.

If you have completed education, training, work experience or hold a license outside of New Jersey, you may be eligible for licensure.

Tips:

Visit the Division's website for a list of boards and committees and the licenses offered.

Review requirements for licensure available on your board or committee website. The board may require you to provide proof of education, training, licensure and experience completed outside of New Jersey through the primary source or through a 3rd party service.

Contact your board with any questions you may have.



What should I do if I don't have a social security number?

Individuals who do not have a Social Security Number (SSN) or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) may apply online. Please complete and submit the **Certification Form for Applicants with no Social Security Number or Individual Taxpayer ID Number**, which is available on the Division's website.

Once submitted, the Division will issue you a **Division Issued Identification Number (DIIN)** which may be used to create a **MyLicense account** and submit an online application.
