SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC PANELS

14. Letter dated January 16, 2007, received from Roger Simonds, Executive Director, National Electrical Contractors Association, concerning the installation of Solar Photovoltaic Array Modular Panels which emit a voltage greater than ten volts when subjected to natural or artificial light. Mr. Simonds stated that the panels are being installed by unlicensed individuals.

At its meeting held February 7, 2007, Mr. McCullough stated that these panels have an opaque covering which is pre-done at the factory with matching modular connections, and at the end of the array, there is the connection that the licensed electrical contractor performs. Mr. McCullough also stated that the grounding and bonding is performed by the electrical contractor after the carpenter bolts the panels to the roof. Mr. McCullough further stated that in his opinion an electrical contractor does not have to install the panels on the roof.

Mr. Papademas stated that it is his opinion that if it is an electrical piece of equipment, that equipment should be installed by a licensed electrical contractor.

Mr. Flaherty stated what about the modular?s that are built right into the roof shingles?

CEASE AND DESIST
