### **COMMUNICATIONS**

### BEN SHEDLOCK, INSTRUCTOR #17

10. At its meeting held on June 2, 2004, the Board requested that Mr. Malec ascertain whether or not the NFPA 72 - 2002 Edition of the National Fire Alarm Code Book has been approved.

Memorandum dated June 3, 2004, received from Mitchell R. Malec stating that the UCC Building Subcode (IBC/2000); the UCC One - And Two - Family Dwelling Subcode (IRC/2000); and the UCC Mechanical Subcode (IMC/2000) has the 1996 edition of the NFPA 72 as a reference standard. The UCC Electrical Subcode (NEC 2002) has the 1999 edition of the NFPA 72 as a reference standard (Bulletin 03-1).

### SUZANNE BOREK, CODE SPECIALIST, DCA

11. At its meeting held on May 19, 2004, the Board approved the drafted response to Ms. Borek's question "who can do their own electrical work"?

Ms. Borek was advised that consistent with prior responses, it is the Board's view that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:5A-18(n) electrical work performed on a detached, owner occupied dwelling, by the owner, or performed by members of the owner's immediate family who also reside in the dwelling, is exempt work and need not be performed by an electrical contractor with a business permit issued by the Board.

12. Board to review an amendment to the Fire Alarm, Burglar Alarm, and Locksmith Advisory Committee regulation (Locksmith).

## **CEASE AND DESIST AGREEMENT**

13. Signed cease and desist agreement was received from Craig Pellichero, North Brunswick, New Jersey, 08902.
