COMMUNICATIONS

CHIP PURCELL

5. E-mail dated July 23, 2015, received from Chip Purcell, t/a Electric Man, LLC, stating he is the holder of an area franchise license agreement for Current Safe which performs non-destructive electrical hazard detection testing in existing residential and small commercial facilities. Mr. Purcell also states the testing is done with infra-red cameras, ultrasonic monitoring, circuit analyzers, resistance meters and like equipment that interacts with, but does not modify, the existing electrical distribution system. The tests are able to reveal potential hazards behind the walls and make recommendations on how to remediate the hazards.

Mr. Purcell asks whether or not an electrical contractor's license is required to perform such work.

DEREK E. DIROCCO, LICENSE #15148

6. This matter was reviewed by the Board on May 6, 2015 (#10).

Letter dated March 17, 2015, received from Derek E. DiRocco, License #15148, t/a Priority Power Company, Inc., requesting an extension to complete his Continuing Education Courses required for the 2015 triennial renewal period.

Mr. DiRocco states he is the sole care giver for his wife who was diagnosed with cancer in August 2014. Mr. DiRocco also states he would have been able to complete his continuing education; however, her surgery was scheduled in March 2015.

The Committee unanimously recommended that Mr. DiRocco's request be held in abeyance pending receipt of a note from his wife's physician indicating that she is in need of constant care. Upon receipt of same, Mr. DiRocco will have until September 30, 2015 to take his courses.

In response to the Board's request, a letter dated July 8, 2015, was received from Mr. DiRocco stating his wife has been scheduled for an additional surgery which will require four to six weeks recovery time. Therefore, Mr. DiRocco is requesting an additional extension until November 30, 2015, to take his continuing education courses.

Mr. DiRocco provided a note from his wife's physician stating he is the sole caregiver.

DONALD A. CLARE, TOWNSHIP OF NEPTUNE

7. Letter dated July 9, 2015, received from Donald A. Clare, Electrical Subcode Official, Township of Neptune, requesting clarification of the HVACR regulation under N.J.A.C. 13:31A-1.3 (a) (1) and (2) "Electrical Work" which states:

a) Except in replacement cases described in the definition of "heating, ventilating, air conditioning, and refrigeration," a master HVACR contractor shall not perform any electrical work:

- 1) With a potential of more than 10 volts, except as provided in (a)2 below; or
  - 2) With a potential of more than 30 volts, in class III structures, as defined by N.J.A.C. 5:23-1.4.

8. Letter dated July 24, 2015, received from Dennis DeAngelo, HVACR License #126, t/a Dennis DeAngelo Plumbing, Heating & Cooling, Inc., stating that there is a gray area regarding work that HVACR contractors are allowed to perform in the installation of a new condenser unit and an existing unit.

ASSEMBLY BILL A4333

9. Assembly Bill A4333 was passed in the Senate on August 13, 2015. This bill exempts certain activities of alarm businesses from statutes governing the practice of locksmithing.
