Legislation

President Vernick presented the Board with the following legislative information: A2088- Clarifies that advertisements by licensed professionals are subject to the Consumer Fraud Act - This bill was passed by the Assembly with amendments and referred to the Senate Commerce Committee on March 15, 2004.

S1259 - Provides that advertisements by persons licensed, registered, appointed or certified to practice their profession or occupation are subject to the consumer fraud act. This bill was referred to the Senate Commerce Committee on

April 29, 2004.

S297/A2809 - Requires a value engineering clause in the specifications for certain construction contracts under the Local Public Contracts Law. This Assembly bill was introduced on May 13, 2004 and referred to the Assembly Housing and Local Government Committee.

A3 - Provides that State contracts for professional services will be publicly bid and authorizes counties and municipalities to publicly bid professional services. Hearings are being conducted by the Assembly State Government committee on draft legislation. Testimony recommending adoption of quality based solutions procedures was provided

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

General Report

The Board, on a motion by BM Patel, second by BM Frantz, unanimously voted ED Russo to be the Board's representative. Additionally, VP Valenti expressed an interest in attending.

ED Russo informed the Board that the license renewal process is ongoing and, as of May 14, 2004, 18,193 licensees have renewed, or 93.20% of the total renewal applications sent.

Full Board Review

Sharachchandra Vishnu Ambekar - #891427

The Board reviewed Mr. Ambekar's application. He is a foreign graduate applying for a PE license by comity.

After a careful review, the Board determined that the evaluation provided by ECEI indicated that the courses taken in India are not the equivalent of an ABET accredited undergraduate degree. BM Patel reviewed this matter and disagreed with the ECEI evaluation.

After further discussion on this matter the Board, on a motion by BM Marshall, second by BM Patel, unanimously voted to approve Mr. Ambekar's application for licensure.

Richard P. Filkins - #990474

The Board reviewed Mr. Filkin's PE application for licensure by comity.

A review of his application indicated that he received an undergraduate degree in English and a graduate degree in regional planning. He has been licensed in New York and Washington as a PE.

The Board, on a motion by BM Bogart, second by BM Patel, unanimously voted to deny Mr. Filkin's application since he does not meet the Board's educational requirements.

Christopher A. Cavanagh - #1003882

Mr. Cavanagh was previously licensed in New Jersey as a PE and allowed his license to lapse in 1992.

The Board, noting that he is currently licensed as a PE in another state, will continue its review of the application based on its comity provision.
