**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

## Legislation

A1763 - Permits a person with a criminal record to obtain certain employment if the disqualifying offense was committed more than ten years ago. The Board, on a motion by BM Bogart, second by BM Patel, unanimously voted to take no position on this bill.

A2772/S1729 - Revises the filing requirements for minor subdivisions. The Board, on a motion by BM Raimondi, second by BM Patel, unanimously voted in favor of this bill.

ED Russo informed the Board of the unavailability of the Rowan University examination site for the April 2005 examinations. He will contact the Dean at Rowan University and discuss available options. In addition, he mentioned that he will be visiting the recently completed NJIT student center site where the examinations will be held.

## National Home Inspector Exam

ED Russo mentioned that three members of the Home Inspection Advisory Committee will take the national home inspector examination to experience a current examination.

## **REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**

### General Report

ED Russo informed the Board that PCS will be collecting a \$125 fee from applicants requesting score verifications. Fees collected will be remitted to NCEES.

ED Russo stated that he met with Deputy Director Anthony Miragliotta last week to discuss future revisions to the recent extension of the filing deadline date of the grandfather provision for home inspector licensure.

A new PCS contract for examination services was provided to the Board. On a motion by BM Bogart, second by BM Marshall, the Board unanimously voted to extend the contract until 2008.

The Board discussed the foreign degree evaluations that are provided by ECEI. The Board requested that ED Russo send a letter to ECEI indicating its dissatisfaction on how foreign degrees are evaluated. It will advise ECEI that many foreign schools, whose curriculums appear to be equivalent to ABET accredited school curriculums, do not seem to be evaluated appropriately.

ED Russo informed the Board that a meeting has been scheduled for September 21, 2004 with the dean of Princeton University to discuss licensure promotion. VP Valenti and BM Koo will be in attendance along with ED Russo and Robert Welsh.

The Board, on a motion by BM Raimondi, second by BM Angeline, unanimously voted to approve the current version of the State Specific Examination for use as the October 2005 examination.

ED Russo informed the Board that the Certificate of Authorization renewal deadline ended on August 31, 2004. To date, 1,326 C/As have been renewed, 378 have not renewed and 1,770 have been issued to date.

ED Russo stated that NCEES has recently appointed BM Patel to its Education Committee.

Mr. Milton asks whether he can retain a new engineer to continue an ongoing project. The Board, upon reviewing the materials submitted, will inform Mr. Milton that this matter should be resolved by the two engineers involved.

Rick Rambo, Computer Operations Manager/ Booth & Associates, Inc  
RE: Digital archiving of sealed documents  
(July 20, 2004)

Mr. Rambo writes to the Board for guidance as to how to digitally archive previously sealed documents.

The Board will advise him that sealing of documents must be done with an impression type seal and that digital or rubber stamp facsimiles of the seal are not permitted. Further, a printed report of a previously scanned and sealed document would not be acceptable without a raised seal. Mr. Rambo will be informed that its regulations state that a licensee must keep the originals of signed and sealed documents and that he should consult with his attorney for

legal advice.

Anne Mahaffy Berman, President/ Mahaffy & Harder Engineering Company

RE: Certificate of Authorization renewal

(August 2, 2004)

Ms. Berman believes that her company does not need a certificate of authorization since it no longer provides engineering services. The Board reviewed her correspondence and shall inform her that it appears that Mahaffy & Harder Engineering Company must obtain a certificate of authorization since it utilizes the term "engineering".

RE: Land Surveyors

(July 21, 2004)

Mr. Nelson writes to the Board requesting the Board's interpretation as to the obligation of a land surveyor to establish a new property line which would contradict a property line set by a court decision. The Board noted that a new deed was filed after a court ruling established the property line. The Board will inform Mr. Nelson that he must abide by the court's decision until such time as it is modified by another court.

RE: Clarification requested on PE seal requirements

(August 11, 2004)

Mr. McCobin asks the Board if it is appropriate for a professional engineer to sign and seal documents from a satellite office in which he/she has had no previous involvement.

The Board reviewed Mr. McCobin's correspondence and will inform him that pursuant to N.J.S.A 45:8-28(f), the term "responsible charge" means the rendering of regular and effective supervision by a professional engineer to those individuals performing services which directly and materially affect the quality and competence of the professional services rendered by the licensee. A professional engineer shall not be deemed to have rendered regular and effective supervision if he was continuously absent from the principal office from which the professional services were rendered.

RE: Professional Engineer emblem

(August 16, 2004)

Mr. Pawlowski writes to the Board requesting that it design an emblem which could be embossed on his gravestone.

The Board will inform him that this is outside of its jurisdiction. However, the Board suggests that he contact the New Jersey Society of Professional Engineers for guidance.

James Bing, PE/ New Energy Options, Inc.

Mr. Bing asked if a contracting company can hire one or more engineering firms to provide a comprehensive engineering design and, if not, would the term "system facilities design," instead of "works facilities design," meet the requirements of N.J.S.A. 45:4B-13.

The Board will inform Mr. Bing that it does not address hypothetical or speculative scenarios and suggest that he contact his legal counsel.

Mr. Kraeft requests clarification as to who can sign a corner marker waiver form. He asks whether the purchaser's attorney can sign it. The Board will inform him that it must be signed by the purchaser.

He further asks whether it is appropriate for an individual, who has been given power of attorney by the purchaser, to sign the corner marker waiver form. The Board will inform him that this issue is being addressed in a proposed regulation, which has been recently published in the New Jersey Register.

Full Board Review

Mark W. Conroy - #934635

The Board reviewed Mr. Conroy's comity application and noticed that he received his undergraduate degree in engineering from Ireland. The ECEI evaluation of his foreign undergraduate degree states that his degree does not meet ABET requirements. The ECEI evaluation of his undergraduate degree indicated that he earned sufficient credits in mathematics and basic sciences, as well as engineering sciences, but did not earn sixteen (16) credits in engineering design.

Mr. Conroy was initially licensed as an engineer in Wisconsin in 1979. The Board determined that the licensing requirements in Wisconsin in 1979 were substantially equivalent to those in this state at a time when 16 credits in engineering design were not required. On a motion by BM Patel, second by BM Valenti, the Board unanimously approved this application.

Ashvin Shah - #918774

Mr. Shah included an evaluation of his foreign degree by ECEI which reflects that he is deficient in credits in mathematics and basic science and humanities. He has been licensed in New York since 1987 and is employed by the New York City Transit Authority.

At the time of the applicant's initial licensure in New York, the Board's regulations did not require 16 credits in engineering design. The Board, on a motion by BM Patel, second by BM Bogart, unanimously approved his application for licensure by comity.

Charles F. Woidt, Jr. - #997409

The Board reviewed Mr. Woidt's comity application for licensure. It previously noted that he received his undergraduate degree from a non-ABET accredited school and he responded by sending in his course catalogs and course work analysis. Mr. Woidt is currently licensed in New Hampshire.

After a review of the submissions, the Board, on a motion by BM Patel, second by BM Raimondi, unanimously voted to approve his application for licensure by comity.

Narinder S. Kohli - #1019612

Mr. Kohli provided the Board with an ECEI evaluation of his undergraduate degree, which indicated he was deficient in humanities and social science credits. However, he did take additional master level courses at Rutgers University. Mr. Kohl currently holds a Delaware license.

The Board, on a motion by BM Patel, second by BM Bogart, unanimously voted to approve his application for licensure by comity.

Grant S. Courtney - #995897

Mr. Courtney applied for licensure by comity. He previously took and passed all examinations in Arizona with the exception of the third portion, which this Board does not require. He also provided the Board with proof that he had obtained a license in Oklahoma based upon the examinations in Arizona.

The Board, on a motion by BM Marshall, second by BM Raimondi, unanimously voted to approve his application for licensure by comity.

Richard P. Filkins - #990474

The Board reviewed Mr. Filkins' application for licensure and determined that he received a PE license in New York in 1998 based upon his experience in lieu of his education. Mr. Filkins has an undergraduate degree in a non-engineering related field.

The Board, on a motion by BM Bogart, second by BM Raimondi, unanimously voted to deny his application for

licensure since his education is not in compliance with its statutes and regulations.

Walter H. Gerstle - #1018106

The Board discussed Mr. Gerstle's application and determined that he does not possess two years of design experience under the direct supervision of a licensed professional engineer.

The Board, on a motion by BM Patel, second by BM Raimondi, unanimously voted to request that he document two years of design experience under the direct supervision of a licensed professional engineer.

Alexander Sharif - #1006309

Mr. Sharif provided the Board with an ECEI evaluation of his undergraduate degree which indicated credit deficiencies. However, he took additional engineering credits earned at the master's level.

The Board, on a motion by BM Patel, second by BM Bogart, unanimously voted to approve his application for licensure by comity.

John Didonato - 1020481

The Board reviewed Mr. Didonato's application and noted that he lacked supervision by a licensed professional engineer. Mr. Didonato holds a PE license in New York.

The Board unanimously voted to deny this application and to request an explanation as to his participation in the business in which he was employed during the period 1985-1989.

Mukesh S. Shah - #1033493

Mr. Shah received a foreign undergraduate degree and provided the Board with an evaluation of his transcript. He also received a graduate degree in engineering from NJIT.

The Board, on a motion by BM Patel, second by BM Marshall, unanimously voted to approve his application for licensure.

Esmail H. Dinan - #1024237

The Board, upon review of Mr. Dinan's comity application for licensure, determined that he does not possess the required design experience.

The Board will advise him that he needs to document two years of original design experience before any further review of his application.

Semyon Rodkin - #1000482

In the review of Mr. Rodkin's application, the Board determined that he submitted an evaluation of his foreign undergraduate degree in 1989 as part of his application for licensure. His license has lapsed for more than five years and he has submitted a new licensure application. Mr. Rodkin also holds a New York PE license.

The Board, on a motion by BM Marshall, second by BM Patel, unanimously voted to approve his application for licensure by comity.

Mr. Anastos requests that the Board reconsider the issuance of a uniform penalty letter. The Board reviewed his request and, on a motion by BM Raimondi, second by BM Patel, unanimously voted to reaffirm its original determination.

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Charles Blumeling stated that he was present at a meeting representing both the New Jersey State Society of Municipal Engineers and the Garden State Land Surveyors Alliance. He stated that the NJ State Society of Municipal Engineers will be holding its 75th Anniversary celebration on October 2 at the Liberty Science Center.

He also spoke about the business practices of some professional engineers who perform septic inspections and

then recommend close business allies or family members to install new septic systems for the client.
