**III. REVIEW OF MINUTES**

Upon motion made by Dr. Vicki Semel and seconded by Dr. Jerome Rosenberg the Committee voted unanimously to approve the minutes for the June 15, 2005 public agenda meeting as presented.

**IV. CORRESPONDENCE**

Marcia H. Rosen, Psy.D. Licensed Clinical Social Worker

By letter dated June 16, 2005, Ms. Rosen, a graduate and faculty member of the New Jersey Institute for Training in Psychoanalysis in Teaneck New Jersey, suggested that the Committee consider a compromise to the current proposal wherein a two-tiered certification of psychoanalysts would be created. She stated that the structure would allow for a distinction between those who are traditionally trained psychoanalysts with a standard of three times a week training analysis and those who are modern psychoanalysts with a standard of less than three times a week training analysis. She opined that the benefits of such an arrangement are that it disenfranchises neither

group and allows the consumer to select the type of analysis he/she desires, while permitting the State to set proficiency standards.

The Committee thanked Ms. Rosen for her comments.

## **V. PUBLIC COMMENT**

Marcia H. Rosen, Psy.D., attended the meeting but made no public comment.

## **VI. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Announcement was made that Acting Director Kimberly Ricketts was confirmed by the State Senate on June 10, 2005 as the Director of Consumer Affairs.

## **VII. LEGISLATIVE/REGULATORY**

As a result of the Committee's receipt of certain comments to the proposed regulations, a number of issues have been raised which require review by Director Ricketts. Those issues include the lack of a grandparenting provision, training requirements providing personal psychoanalysis at a frequency of three times a week, and a preference for mandatory licensing of psychoanalysts as opposed to voluntary certification of psychoanalysts to ensure public protection. With regard to the appointment of Committee members, issues have been raised concerning the composition of the current Committee, the holdover status of those Committee members, and the request for the appointment of Committee members representing the various psychoanalytic schools of thought. Finally, there was a question raised whether the practice of psychoanalysis is included in the scope of practice for individuals licensed by the Boards of Medical Examiners, Nursing, Psychology and Social Work. It was determined that the Committee would send a letter to the respective Boards requesting their responses to the question raised.
