i. Status of Board Operations

Acting Executive Director, Howard Pine, informed the Board he is actively working on the Board's request to fill the State Member seat that has remained open since 2022.

The Division of Consumer Affairs will begin interviewing in the next two weeks for the position of Executive Director for this Board. Mr. Pine anticipates filling this role within the next several months.

VII. COMMITTEE REPORT:

i. <u>Shreiber School of Veterinary Medicine Committee Report</u>

The committee met on October 18, 2024. The committee discussed options for licensure of veterinarians applying for licensure who have institutional licenses only as well as veterinarians who have graduated from non-accredited veterinary schools but are (American) Board certified with attention to processing applications expeditiously.

At this time, there is no future committee meeting scheduled.

Motion by Dr. Croman, seconded by Dr. Beeber to form a sub-committee of 3 Board members to review applications to be ratified at next available Board meeting.

VIII. REGULATORY AFFAIRS:

i. Bill Comment A4505

(Nicole Parelli, Regulatory Analyst)

This Bill codifies certain requirements and stipulations for licensed veterinarians to engage in telemedicine and telehealth.

The Bill takes the subchapter 4A of the Regulations and makes it into a Statute.

The Board discussed the downside of taking subchapter 4A of the Regulations and making it into a Statute which is that as technology evolves, it will be difficult for the Board to revise regulations to keep up with technology which may be needed to protect the consumer.

The Board recommends the NJVMA to take the lead on contacting the legislature.

Motion by Dr. Beeber, seconded by Dr. Bruno, to oppose Bill A4505.

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Motion passed unanimously.

IX. CORRESPONDENCE:

i. Vineet Parikh

Pharmacist Vineet Parikh asks this Board if pharmacists can provide vaccination services, specifically to dogs.

Board members discussed how providing vaccines and the required exam to do so is the practice of veterinary medicine which is restricted to veterinarians. Additional concerns were raised about the health consequences of allowing animals into a pharmacy setting.

Motion by Dr. Beeber, seconded by Dr. Bruno to respond that vaccination of anything other than personally owned pets is considered practice of veterinary medicine in violation of N.J.S.A. 45:16-8.1

Motion approved unanimously.

XI. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

i. <u>Dr. Michael Yurkus</u> – New Hampshire has passed a new bill that will permit the New Hampshire Board of Veterinary Medicine to grant conditional temporary licenses to applicants that meet certain requirements. He is inquiring if the New Jersey Board would consider this type of license.

The Board replied that they would want to look at this bill and discuss the details and provisions of this type of license.

Dr. Yurkus will bring the New Hampshire bill to the next Board meeting.

XII. PUBLIC HEARING

i. Louis Grasso, D.V.M. -

This mater, regarding Dr. Grasso's conduct related to race horse doping, opened on June 10, 2024 by verified complaint motion to proceed summarily regarding Dr. Grasso's conduct related to race horse doping.

Dr. Grasso appeared for this hearing by phone from prison, without council.

Hearing began at 10:52 A.M.

DAG Stacy-Ann Davy provided grounds for discipline and presented an argument in the liability phase then asked the Board to find in favor of the Attorney General.

Exhibits P1, P2, and P3 (Certifications A-I) were moved into evidence without objection from Dr. Grasso.

Dr. Grasso then presented his case regarding liability from 11:10 A.M. until 11:39 A.M.

DAG Davy informed the Board that Dr. Grasso said nothing to rebut the Attorney General's case but, instead, re-litigated his guilt or innocence. Dr. Grasso participated in a scheme involving doping of horses.

Motion by Dr. Bruno, seconded by Dr. Beeber to go into executive session for advice of counsel. Motion passed unanimously.

The Board convened into executive session at 11:12 A.M. and returned back into public session at 12:23 P.M.

Motion by Dr. Beeber, seconded by Dr. Bruno to find the Attorney General has proven grounds for discipline against Dr. Grasso on N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(b)(e)(f)

Motion passed unanimously.

Dr. Grasso provided a statement.

DAG Davy recommended revocation of Dr. Grasso's license for five years suspended to include costs. DAG introduced P4 – Certification of Costs. Dr. Grasso said that he's "financially broke".

Motion by Dr. Bruno, seconded by Dr. Beeber to return to executive session for advice of counsel. Motion passed unanimously.

After a review of the evidence the Board finds the following discipline is warranted:

- 10 year active suspension
- \$2,000.00 civil penalty

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Motion by Dr. Beeber, seconded by Dr. Bruno, to determine a 10 year active suspension with \$2,000.00 civil penalty.

Motion passed unanimously.

Hearing concluded at 12:58 P.M.

XIII. ADJOURNMENT:

The public portion of the meeting concluded at 12:58 P.M.

Dr. Beeber made a motion, seconded by Dr. Bruno, for the Board to go into executive session to discuss matters exempt from the open public meetings act pursuant to N.J.S.A 10:4-12(b).
